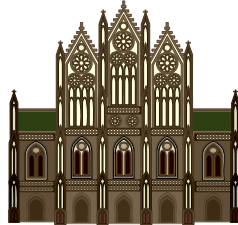


Linz, Austria
Johannes Kepler University
Fall Quarter 2008



Program Description: Students earn 18 credits while studying at an Austrian university. This includes 6 credits of German language study and 12 credits of business courses fulfilling CoB focus or integral requirements. Business classes are taught in English.

Course Descriptions:

German Language: the quarter begins with three weeks of intensive language classes in September. Students continue their language study during the entire quarter.

Students choose from a range of business course offerings.

Past classes have included: Cross-Cultural Management, Global Accounting, International Financial Markets, and Multicultural Virtual Teams

Eligibility: All CoB/UC students who have completed at least their sophomore year: CoB students must have completed Global Business Environment (22INTB390) and the core classes in their focus prior to participation. All applicants must be in good academic standing.

Living Accommodations: Students live in a dorm and have the option of sharing a room with an Austrian or international student.

Transportation: Students are responsible for their own round trip airfare between home and Austria. Students may want to purchase a Eurail pass for @ \$650 to travel throughout Europe during the quarter or purchase no-frills airline tickets.

Travel Documents: 1) Passport - Download the passport application from www.travel.state.gov/download_applications.html. (Allow 12-14 weeks for delivery.)
2) International Student ID: \$22 available from UC International, 3134 One Edwards.

Grants: All students may apply for up to \$500 in funding from UC International (deadline July 15), unless they were the recipient of another UC International grant in the previous 12 months. CoB scholarships for an additional \$400 are available to CoB students.

Note: You are also responsible to pay UC full time tuition fall quarter.

Application Deadline: March 30, 2008

Linz (population 203,000) situated on the banks of the Danube, is the third largest city in Austria. It is about two hours by train west of Vienna and two hours east of Salzburg. The city dates to Roman settlers who valued its strategic river location. The city has an outstanding neo-Gothic cathedral and the center of the city features a variety of Baroque and Rococo architecture. Mozart briefly called Linz home, but it is best known among classical music lovers as the home of Anton Bruckner. Over 50 per cent of the city is "green", and the bike path along the banks of the Danube, from Passau in Bavaria to Vienna, is a genuine attraction for cyclists.

The region around Linz is full of recreational opportunities. In the winter there are a large number of ski resorts only one or two hours away by car. More than seventy clean and clear lakes of the Salzkammergut region are a haven for anyone interested in water sports. Adventurous individuals can hang-glide in Windischgarsten, explore caves in the Dachstein region, do some white-water rafting on the Steyr River or climb Alpine peaks. The hinterland of Linz is filled with beautiful monasteries and churches. The gentle, rolling landscape of the Mühlviertel region with its woods, fields, farms and orchards is ideal for extended bike tours.
